<u>Naval 8 P16</u> Nov 9<sup>th</sup> 1917 "Very fine morning. Mackenzie and Corbett did the first patrol from 6.15 to 8.30. Mackenzie got close behind a German machine like a `LVG' and opened fire but his gun jambed after firing only a few shots.

<u>Naval 8 P18</u> "On the afternoon patrol we lost Corbett. We heard afterwards that in a fight with 2 enemy machines, near Belville Wood, he brought one down and was then killed himself in the air. A fine youngster, he was only 18, with the heart of a lion, and all the attributes which go to make a successful fighting pilot. He had become a general favourite in the Squadron and his loss was keenly felt. He was buried on December 6<sup>th</sup> in the CCS Cemetery at Heilly.
